- Contributed to the City of Honolulu's project for additional HPD security cameras
- Partner for the 2019 Public Safety Conference, led by HLTA and focusing on public-private solutions to increase safety and awareness in Waikiki
- Ambassador beach patrol expansion of scope, to cover a larger footprint and more frequent visibility

- New custodial contractor to increase the district's cleanliness and appearance
- Launched a strategic planning process, to shape the WBIDA for the next 10 years




