Sit-Lie Advisories vs. Private Property Assistance

You may have noticed that two of the categories on the WBIDA monthly statistics include "Sit-Lie Advisories" and "Private Property Assistance". While on patrol, our Aloha Ambassadors remain on the lookout for safety and security concerns throughout the district.

WAIKIKI HOMELESSNESS STAKEHOLDERS MEETING

The WBIDA is hosting a December meeting that will bring together presentations from the State, City, and the WBIDA on homeless outreach programs and statistics, specific to Waikiki.

If you are interested in attending and have not already received an invite, please contact our office.

The first category, "Sit-Lie Advisories", captures the number of times our ambassadors have verbally informed individuals of their violation of the sit-lie ordinance in the Waikiki District. If the individual does not comply or shows aggressive behavior, HPD is called for enforcement. Since this follows a City and County Ordinance, it takes place when individuals are on public property, such as the sidewalk.

The second category, "Private Property Assistance", represents the number of times our ambassadors have assisted on issues that are shared between the public-private property line, such as spills and sanitation concerns, trespassers, and panhandling. If applicable, an advisory is given, with follow-up coordination by a WBIDA Outreach Ambassador or Custodial Crew member, and reporting to the business or property when necessary.

Waikiki District Services, Comparison by Year



The WBIDA crew are working every day of the week, to continue to provide continuity for a clean and safe Waikiki District, with emphasis on cleaning, disinfection, safety, and hospitality.

Below are statistics from this past month compared to the same month for the past two years, and shows a distinct difference resulting from COVID-19 impacts.

Notable this month was reaching a 40,000 count for individual pieces of infrastructure cleaned. These touchpoints include trash receptacles, pedestrian walk buttons, bike racks, publication racks, traffic and light poles, and utility boxes.

Not only is this over a 400% increase from our pre-pandemic service, but emphasizes the importance of health and safety in public spaces.
