Graffiti Cleanup on the Royal Hawaiian Groin

Over several days, the WBID maintenance ambassadors cleaned up graffiti tags on the ocean groin that is adjacent to Sheraton Waikiki and The Royal Hawaiian. As the groin is a State of Hawaii asset, permission was granted through a Right-of-Entry (ROE) permit with the Department of Land & Natural Resources (DLNR). This ROE stipulates multiple levels of environmental precautions and that activities must take place during low tide and low surf conditions. The crew did fantastic work, and an extra special mahalo goes out to HPD D6 for pre-clearing the area and the Sheraton for coordinating our equipment access.
